## UL40 Scholarships

2012 marked the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the University of Limerick and in celebration of this momentous occasion, the UL40 scholarships were established. Based on an individual's performance in the leaving cert, 40 scholarships are



awarded to both first year students and mature students to the value of €2000 each. Ten of the scholarships are awarded to first year students with an availability of two per faculty. (Science and Engineering, Education and Health Sciences, Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences and Kemmy Business School) These scholarships are solely based on an individual's performance in the leaving certificate and are awarded after a student's registration to their UL degree programme. ## Stryker Scholarship



The Stryker Scholarship is targeted at students registering for the [Bachelor of Business Studies](#) at the University of Limerick. The scholarship valued at €2540 is awarded to one individual each year based on their Leaving Certificate performance.

## Women in Engineering Bursary Awards

Women in engineering bursaries are awarded to incoming first year students based on the points achieved in their Leaving Certificate. LM116 [Bachelor of Engineering](#) , LM118 [BE Electronic and Computer Engineering](#) , LM077 [BE Aeronautical Engineering](#) and LM115 [BE Chemical and Biochemical Engineering](#) degree programmes at the University of Limerick are considered for Women in Engineering Bursaries. There are up to eight bursaries, valued at €500 each.

This €700 award, established in honour of Edith and Leslie Downer is awarded to the student with the highest Leaving Certificate points enrolled in any one of the following degree programmes:



## Accommodation at UL

The greater affordability for off campus accommodation at UL makes for a much greater student experience. Limerick has an average rent per month of €956 or €7,648 per year. Limerick is more cost effective than both its Dublin and Galway counterparts with a current standing at 47% cheaper than Dublin while 10% cheaper than accommodation offered in Galway.

Having been awarded Law School of the Year in 2017 at the AIB Private Banking Irish Law Awards, the University of Limerick aims to take the lead once again with the introduction of American attorney Dean Strang to the teaching staff beginning February 10, 2018.
