

ANNOUNCING THE 2024-2025 GENERATION APPRENTICESHIP COMPETITION IN SECOND LEVEL SCHOOLS AND CENTRES



Through this competition students will learn about national apprenticeship opportunities and how they can combine future careers with their commitment to green values and a sustainable future for all

Competition brief

The 2024-2025 Generation Apprenticeship competition invites students to create an A letter that can be used to replace the A in Apprenticeship and bring its many career opportunities to life. Entries, which are free, can be in one of three categories:

- 1. Create a physical A
- 2. Create a virtual A

3. Create a short apprenticeship podcast

Entries can be from a team of students or from individuals. Individuals or teams are asked to complete a **competition entry form** by Friday 27 September 2024 and submit it by email to GAcompetition@nao.ie.

Those submitting entries will be contacted by the National Apprenticeship Office team. They will receive a specially-designed, large-format Generation Apprenticeship poster for their school or centre.

Entry to the competition provides students with practical knowledge as well as the opportunity to share their ideas with a national audience and to compete for a cash prize of €500 for the winning entry in each category.

A short video on the apprenticeship.ie website will give students ideas for their entries. Category 1 sets a general 'making' brief, while category 2 requires use of digital tools to create an A letter. Category 3, the Generation Apprenticeship podcast, is a new category this year.

Competition guidance

Entries for each category should include the following:

Categories 1 and 2

A short video (max. 2-minutes) or a PowerPoint presentation (max. 12 slides) which includes images of their entry, a short explanation of the how the A was designed, how it was constructed, and its climate action messages.

Category 3

In the Generation Apprenticeship podcast learners are asked to submit two minutes of audio/video discussing the opportunity for the national apprenticeship system to champion and advance climate action at home and abroad.

Competition prizes and profile

As well as a cash prize the winning entrants

will feature in an outdoor poster and advertising campaign that promotes the 70+ apprenticeship opportunities now available and the important role future careers play in tackling climate change. The winning category 3 entry will be commissioned as a 20-minute podcast.

Competitors meet enterprise leaders

The number of students who want to work in planet positive jobs and careers is everincreasing. This year's shortlisted entries will have the opportunity of presenting their ideas to senior leaders at an exciting event in April 2025, enabling an exchange on the values that are shaping the next generation workforce.

Closing date for entries
